Thank you for allowing me to serve as your Township Supervisor. There has been a lot going on at the Township Hall. The parking lot has been paved and a sidewalk put in down to the splash pad to make our facilities more accessible for people with disabilities. On the north side of the Township Hall we are installing a pickleball court, this will give people of the community a new form of recreation in the area. Pickleball is a fun sport that combines many elements of tennis, badminton and ping-pong. It is played both indoors or outdoors on a badminton-sized court and a slightly modified tennis net. The court and the improvements are being paid for in part by a grant from the DNR.

Election News

November 5, 2019, a special election was held to determine the fate of a school bond proposal. Of the Township's 2,301 registered voters, 692 cast their votes in person and by absentee ballot. Michigan election law now allows any voter to vote absentee by contacting the Clerk's office prior to election day. There are three elections scheduled for 2020 and the Clerk's office is looking for additional election inspectors. An inspector must be a registered voter over 18 years of age or a 16 or 17-year-old student. Anyone interested in being an election inspector can fill out an application in the Clerk's office.
